The DNR responded favorably to the District's request and has extended both grants to 12/31/2021. This will allow another summer season to conduct studies under the grants.

New Business

New lake resident, Jill Luikhart, introduced herself. She and her husband have purchased a cabin at the south end of the lake. They are avid fishing people and have concerns about wake boat activity on the lake. She inquired if there is any study on the effects of wake boats on the lake shore and other boaters and if any regulation is possible in order to protect shoreline and fishing people. There was discussion of studies done by New Hampshire and an ongoing study about Lake Minnetonka by the Univ. of Minnesota.
